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Remote Learning Procedure

INTENT

- The school will at all times follow its safeguarding policy and the DfE Guidelines for Safeguarding regardless of the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. There will be no modifications made to safeguarding policies or procedures.
- The school will do all that it can during the COVID-19 epidemic, to ensure that it carries out the intentions stated in
 its other policies. It recognises that some circumstances caused by the epidemic may require it to make temporary
 modifications to some of those policies.
- Where the school is unable to carry out the intentions of a policy, it will attempt to seek alternative effective means
 of meeting those intentions.
- Modifications of policies will be temporary. As soon as the circumstances change to allow the school to return to normal working the modifications will end and the policies will stand.
- The school will keep parents informed of any necessary modifications to its policies.
- The school will make every endeavour within its resources, to offer appropriate support to those pupils with SEND,
 EHCPs and any child who is having difficulty accessing work.
- The school will liaise with the LA and other appropriate agencies to maintain the specialist support that some pupils may need.

IMPLEMENTATION

- During the COVID-19 pandemic, the school will fully implement the DfE Guidelines for Safeguarding and its policies for safeguarding, care and support of all pupils, especially those pupils who are vulnerable or at risk. This will be done without any modifications being to those policies in any circumstances.
- The school will do its best to remain open for all pupils in order to maintain care, teaching and learning on site as long as this can be done safely.
- The school will continue to implement all of its policies to underpin its responsibilities unless the pandemic makes necessary for it to make temporarily modifications to the provisions in some of those policies.
- The school will use its website and other means of effective communication to keep governors, parents and others
 informed of any necessary temporary modifications to policies.
- The school will offer appropriate support to those with SEND and EHCPs in line with its policies unless the pandemic causes modifications to be made.
- It will liaise with appropriate agencies to maintain the specialist support that some pupils may need.
- The school will remain available to offer help and advice to parents who request support with the provision of learning at home.

IMPACT

This policy sets out the intent and broad guidelines for implementation that will underpin the school's actions in relation to its policies during the COVID-19 pandemic. The prime intention of the school is that pupils will continue to be educated on site and that all provision will be guided by the school's policies, unless there is a need to make temporary modifications. It is expected that all parents and the school will work together in partnership to resolve any problems that need to be overcome if policies need to be modified due to the constraints placed on the school be the COVID-19 pandemic.

What 'remote learning' can I expect?

- This information is to be used as a general guide and parents can expect further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence.
- There are 2 general scenarios outlined below; the first scenario where your child is not permitted to attend school and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble not being permitted to attend school.
- In the event of school partially closing or individuals or groups isolating, there will be full access to sequenced learning on Class Dojo while they are absent.
- Providing that your child is not ill or showing symptoms of COVID 19, the expectation will be, that they complete the
 daily learning set out on the timetable for the days that your child is absent from school, whether it be two days or
 two weeks. This will be uploaded in two-week blocks, which will be the maximum time your child may be at home
 isolating. Please check your child is accessing the correct week's learning.
